CanSupport is India's largest free home-based palliative care programme who have been caring for cancer patients since 1996. They run homecare visits to patients that are too sick to travel, out-patient clinics to provide essential supportive care, day care programmes for cancer patients and caregivers, and counselling for patients and their family members. The services they provide are free of charge. They have been honoured by the World Health Organisation in 2017 with the Public Health Champion award for sustainable contribution to public health.

Fairlop Lions Club (CIO) have been long-standing partners with CanSupport, whose members have attended the site regularly. Sadly, Covid has placed restrictions on visitations, but also bought about an enhanced need for support for their patients. with good food and music.







DG'S CORNER


On 30 July, I attended the Monthly Group 23 meeting. This meeting was about LCIF Grants and it was good to interact with the District Governors (DGs) around the world.
