



#### New Voices success story of the month

#### This is a success story in the Service category

A National Menstrual Hygiene Survey was carried out under the leadership of Mr A.C. Nielsen by the Government of India. It was found that only 12% of women have access to sanitary pads all over India. An average maturing schoolgirl misses 50 days a year due to a natural bodily function. This study also found that 88% of women all over the country do not have any access to pads on a day-to-day basis. Unfortunately, Reproductive Tract Infections (RTI) are 70% more common in women who do not use sanitary pads, compared to those who do use sanitary pads. This is due to the cost of the pads and lack of education in many communities. In fact, an average pad costs about Rs 5-12 (5-12 pence in GBP).

Therefore, we decided to start a project in Gujarat Ahmedabad in the Sanand area, which covers five villages including Chancharwadi Vasna, Changodar, Moraiya, Rajoda and Sari. Fifteen (full-time and part-time) volunteers were found, to start initially from Chancharwadi Vasna, who will be trained as a small scale industry to manufacture and distribute sanitary pads. We worked this as a cost-effective plan, after making it a self-funding and self-generating effort to solve a simple problem which has the potential to improve the lives of many villagers. After using the product, the pads will be safely and hygienically collected by volunteers and disposed sustainably by being used as fireballs for fuel.

Monthly village meetings have been planned in a local Panchayat School, with presentations discussing the health and hygiene benefits of using these pads, compared to reusing cloth. Posters and banners will be exhibited in the villages to inform and encourage women and girls. We have also planned to put special experts into place to educate women about other health issues, and to conduct free medical screening checkups. We hope that this will reduce RTI infections by 70%.

We will evaluate the project with regular monitoring and quarterly reports coming back to the coordinator. The coordinator will report back to the club, having regularly collected the information from the supervisor and the people producing and distributing the products.


I attended a MacMillan Coffee morning held by Heston Lions Club.

Pictured on the right is me attending the formation of London St. Johns Wood Lions Club. It was another fantastic evening that was a pleasure to be at.


