#### New Voices success story of the month

Lion Vandana organised a club social outing on 5 September to the Cotswolds. The trip was a great success with the club members and friends. She took this opportunity to promote her chosen charity, Guide Dogs for the Blind, as she felt this was worthy of our support. Guide Dogs provide vision and mobility to some 80,000 registered blind people in this country. She raffled some prizes and raised £130 for this charity. The club, recognising her efforts, agreed to contribute £182 toward her cause. On 4 November, £312 was donated to Guide Dogs for training a puppy for two years.

Hatch End Centennial Lions Club has now sponsored a puppy called Pudding for two years. After the training, the dog will be partnered with a blind person. During the time of the training, Guide Dogs will send the club Pudding's updates and progress reports



## **Christmas Party with Little Heath School**

The past few years has seen Fairlop Lions Club jointly enjoy a Christmas Party with Little Heath School, a school for pupils aged 11 to 18 with autism, a wide range of learning difficulties and complex needs. Sadly, the pandemic greatly limited the services and support we have been able to provide, not just to Little Heath, but generally.

Fortunately, this year, we were able to join hands with Little Heath again to fund and assist with their annual Christmas event, complete with their own Grotto, Santa and Elf (both played wonderfully by Lion members!). The school has just under 200 pupils on their books and Fairlop Lions Club funded chocolate selection boxes for all. The morning saw Key Stage 3 and 4 receiving their gifts from Santa – their excitement was real! In the afternoon, we were treated to a choir and Christmas carols from Key Stage 5 pupils – who also got to meet Santa and receive their gift. Little Heath had meticulously arranged their classes/groups into their own "bubbles" and had a one-way system in place for pupils to enter and exit after having met Santa. The afternoon event was also supported by Redbridge Mayor.

We were also able to donate 150 books for their library – which was gratefully received by the school. On the day of the party, we learnt of a "Christmas stall market" that the school were holding two days later to raise funds for the Refugee Children of Afghanistan, so Fairlop Lions Club made a donation towards this fundraiser.

Our thanks go to all the staff at Little Heath and Fairlop Lions Club for making this event a success.

All three members have been helping the club with their service event of volunteering at the vaccination centre for the past few months. The new members were inducted by Past District Governor (PDG) Mike Baldwin on Thursday 13 January 2022.

LP Kadambari Shah and members of Milton Keynes Central Lions Club took up a challenge from the local Milton Keynes Council to help babies aged zero to four years and teenagers aged 14 to 17 years. These were vulnerable children who would not normally get a Christmas present. The club agreed to present 20 boxes of gifts with clothing, shoes and toys for the babies, and another 20 boxes of gifts with hats, gloves, toiletries, books and more for 10 boys and 10 girls between the ages of 14 and 17.

The requirements were published on social media in early November and we were so grateful for everyone's generosity! By the end of November we had collected most of the kind donations, and club members then met on 29 November 2021 to fill boxes with the gifts. These gifts were then donated to the council offices on 6 December 2021.
