Since 1968, LCIF has awarded more than 1.1 billion U.S. dollars in grants! As the charitable arm of Lions Clubs International, LCIF is committed to support Lions life-changing, often lifesaving, service possible.

LCIF is the only charity that serves 1.4 million Lions and the whole world! A vast majority of funds received by LCIF are donated by Lions clubs and individual members, and 100% of our donations directly support LCIF's Global causes. At present we are in the final five months of our most ambitious Campaign 100 to raise \$300 million by 30 June 2022, to serve 200+million people every year. You will be pleased to know that over \$251 million has been achieved towards our goal of \$300 million. Our aim is that Campaign 100 will make even greater impact on causes we already support (Vision, Youth, Disaster Relief, Humanitarian Efforts) as well as these new global causes: Diabetes, Childhood Cancer, Hunger, and the Environment.

There is still time to commit to become a model club by pledging \$500 per member. Clubs who take the challenge in the final year of Campaign 100 will now have full three years to fulfil their commitment. All donations made since 1 July 2017 count towards Model Club goals. Young Ambassador

The Young Ambassador of the 21st Century MD Finals took place on Friday 18 and Saturday 19 February 2022. Nina Andersen (our winning District candidate) took part representing her sponsoring club (Hemel Hempstead Lions Club), District 105A and the Youth of our District. Although the finals were via Zoom, over 100 people attended to socialise with the candidates and hear their project presentations.

The afternoon saw the participants give presentations on their diverse projects. All were worthy winners, but one had to be chosen: Khan Odita, a 14 year old author sponsored by City of Liverpool Lions Club District CN. Khan will represent Lions MD105 in the European Final in Zagreb in October 2022. Cameron Cox from District SE won the MD Shipshape Award and a future trip on a Tall Ship.

Nina's first project, 'Community Senior Music', was set up with semi-professional musicians performing concerts at various care homes. When possible, this initiative will be started again. Unable to perform due to COVID-19, she still wanted to find a way of bringing connection to care home residents and counter social isolation, particularly for those unable to receive any visitors. When the COVID-19 pandemic closed care homes to visitors to protect residents and staff, Nina set up the initiative Community Senior Letters, matching schools to care homes so that students could write letters to lonely elderly residents to lift spirits and provide human connection during the difficult times. The project went viral, and she single-handedly linked almost 70,000 school children from primary schools in London, Edinburgh and Dublin as well as schools over 20 different countries internationally with care homes in their areas.

Nina's work for this project has been awarded the Prime Minister's Points of Light Award, the Children and Young People Now Award, the Hammersmith and Fulham Youth Achievement Award and the Faith and Community Beliefs Award. It has been listed in the Independent's Happy List and articles appeared in the Telegraph, HuffPost, the Speaker and Primary Times. Nina has recently been featured in Captain Sir Tom Moore's One Hundred Reasons to Hope book which was published in September. This feature led her to become one of three Youth Ambassadors for the Captain Tom Foundation working closely with the family of Sir Tom to promote her new book, as they share a similar mission: reducing loneliness and bridging the gap between young and old people.

Fairlop Leos serve with a smile

Throughout COVID-19, Fairlop Leo Club have continued with their many avenues of service. As the only Alpha Leo Club in our District, they are a true example of how youth can interact with Lions and their community. Their major projects over the last two years to date include weekly telephone calls to thirteen local senior citizens who were isolating, but now just enjoy the intergenerational friendships that have built up. Two of the seniors have underlying illnesses and were unable to give their dogs long walks – in stepped the Leos with a rota of daily walks. The Leos have also purchased Shoes that Grow for disadvantaged children in Kenya, and provided 100 rucksacks filled with educational items for children in Romania. They partnered with their local neighbourhood to plant tree whips to help create a Forest of Thanks for their local NHS staff – ensuring families could participate by donating 40 smaller spades to the Environment Team for children to use. The Leos have also: carried out food collections for the local Food Bank, delivered food parcels to families in crisis, read with younger children, collected hearing aids and spectacles and distributed books to local schools and libraries.
