

Lions Day with the United Nations in Vienna

Lions Clubs International (LCI) and the United Nations have a close partnership. In 1945, LCI was invited by the United Nations to join the group of writers to write the Charter of Non-Government Organizations. Henceforward, many projects of UNICEF, WHO, UNODC, and UNESCO were conducted together. To celebrate this historical event, Lions Day with UN (LDUN) is celebrated every year in March in UNHQ. This year, LDUN was celebrated in Vienna Parliament on 30 March.

Humanitarian goals are the base of the partnership between LCI and the United Nations. In Europe, the partnership is especially important in Southern and Eastern Europe. The Lions Quest Program is supported by the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) with big engagement.

On the occasion of the earthquakes in Albania and Croatia, important relief projects were started. Lions are first to contribute in any calamity taking place in world. Even now, a big contribution has been made for Ukraine's refugees crisis. One of the major yearly programs is the Lions Peace Poster Contest, which has been running for more than 30 years. This year in Austria, approximately 10,000 students participated.

This year LDUN was organised in Austrian Parliament, as the UN Office was closed due to Covid. Lions from all European countries participate. Incidentally, I was the only delegate from Great Britain and Ireland. I had the opportunity of meeting all top officials in Lions HQ and many Austrian leaders. International Lions President Douglas Alexander presented me Progressive Melvin Johns Award in presence of LCIF Vice Chairperson
