Lion Ajit was born in Kisumu in 1931, in a family of five brothers and five sisters. He left Kenya 1964 to come to the UK. During his time in Kenya he was a science teacher and on arriving in the UK he studied electronics and became an Executive Electronics Engineer with BT until he retired in 1990, the rest as they, is history. He was a Charter Member of Southall Lions Club, and president of the club from 1973-74 and again in 1996-97 and in 2014-2015. He had served, with distinction, as Zone Chairman on two occasions, in 1990-91 and 2005-06 and served as a Deputy Distract Governor in 1991-92. His appetite for serving as a Lion was not being satisfied, so he was the Secretary for several times during his time as a Lion and has held this important post with dignity, efficiency, and total commitment for the last 16 years. (Taking a year out to be the President). Lions were awed by his capacity for hard work and efficiency and by the 'presence' he brought to the office. He portrays firm but totally fair administrative eloquence. He was always in time to send the monthly reports to Lions Clubs International. He had stepped down as our Club Secretary from July 2022.



The London Air Ambulance saved the life of our nephew. We were at a wedding and unexpectedly there was a commotion outside that a little child was not breathing properly

When the emergencies services were called. The ambulance would have taken over an hour to get to the location, hence why, the London Air Ambulance was contacted and they arrived within 35 minutes and had all the necessary medical equipment on board and were able to revive the little lad. I believe and it does happen everyday people getting injured on the roads, train etc, this is where, London Air Ambulance makes the difference for those who require urgent treatment.

On average, five critically-injured Londoners need our help every day. Our helicopters bring medics to the scene at the roadside within minutes to provide life-saving care. The current helicopters are becoming increasingly difficult to maintain. Now, we're up against time to raise £15 million to replace your helicopters by the end of 2024. Without the support of the London community, there is no life-saving air ambulance service, because we are a charity. So please give what you can afford today. together, we can fund these life-saving helicopters and protect our city for years to come.

## **Borehole Report For Projects in Kenya 2021-2022**

Although I was in Kenya last October 2022, I could not attend the opening of the Boreholes personally, due to my health. On 22 October the Borehole in Machakos was opened and on 28th October the borehole in Makindu was opened. I am grateful to Past ZC Lion Bhupinder Singh Jandoo for taking on the projects to represent District 105A. My heartfelt thanks to PZC Lion Bhupinder and the team for successfully accomplishing these projects. 2021/2022 Convention Bags and Appreciation Certificates were given out to all who were involved in getting the project finished. A letter was received from Ramgarhia Youth Association (RYA) to District 105A for contribution towards this project which has brought fruitful results, and impacted the lives of many.

#### Borehole Report for Makindu Borehole

Location: Manyatta Sub-location, Makindu Sub- County, Makueni county, Kenya Beneficiaries: Approximately 13,566 community members and students in 11 schools

A semi-arid and frequently drought-stricken area in the lower eastern region of Kenya.

Seven primary schools and four secondary schools will also have access to the borehole thus improving access to water and consequently improving impacting school hygiene.

#### Borehole Report for Machakos County, Kenya

Location: Kalama Sub-County, Machakos County, Kenya Beneficiaries: 120 pupils and teachers at Kwa-katheke primary school. Over 3,000 community members and students in 10 other schools.

A solar pump system was installed for a more affordable and sustainable solution. Sufficient water will be used to irrigate new school farms which will provide nutritious school lunches to all the schools that are in the location.

The sale of water to the community will generate income to maintain the borehole for more long-term project success. This will be managed by the project partners. If anyone wants a more detailed report on these projects please get in touch with me.
