## **DBS Disclosure and Barring Service – Trusted Adult**

There have been many conversations around the need for Lions to be DBS checked. By being DBS checked we are at the very least, and at the most basic level, demonstrating an awareness of Safeguarding. This helps protect ourselves as an organisation as well as the vulnerable children and adults we serve.

The Resolution below was unanimously passed at the Multiple District convention in Birmingham:

"all new Lions will be as far as legally possible (Scotland have different rulings) require to be DBS checked as soon as arrangements are made with the District Vulnerable Persons officer. All district secretaries will be asked to produce a list of all new Lions from March last year to the current date and arrangements will be made for checking of these new Lions."

Further advice and information was also given:

#### DBS - "Sensitive Role" Trusted Adult

Since we are a "Service Organisation" and our motto is "WE SERVE", we can frequently find ourselves in one-to-one situations with vulnerable people. Many of the activities that Lions members undertake are not officially considered "regulated". However, many involve interactions with vulnerable children/adults, and in those situations it is appropriate to consider DBS checks which will provide reassurance to those we help.

MD recommends all members of Lions Clubs in those situations undertake a criminal record check through DBS as a safety precaution and protection for Lions both individually and as a club. Some clubs ask all members to undergo the check and so have ultimate flexibility in deciding who takes part in activities involving children or vulnerable adults.

If the club policy is NOT to take to take part in any activities involving vulnerable children/adults, in either this country or another, then DBS is not required. However, clubs should seriously consider the vetting process and possibly undertake risk assessments. They should also consider the fact that not having DBS checks within the club seriously restricts future opportunities for service activities.

The Charities Commission also recommends that DBS checks should be obtained for trustees of charities that work with vulnerable children/adults. If at any time a club is held to account, then at least we can say we have an awareness of Safeguarding, have followed best practice, and have taken all reasonable precautions to protect the vulnerable within our communities.

At the Council of Governors meeting last month, we learned that the prospect of the launch of the Spot Camera is getting closer. We expect that in the next few months, the DG team will be looking to train suitable Lions interested in this amazing project within our schools:

- You will of course have to have a Disclosure and Barring Service check and have to produce your certificate.
- If you have been checked already and you are on the update system please supply your update notification along with your certificate.
- Those of you who are not on the update system will be required to be rechecked and then you can join the update system within 28 days of issue of your new certificate.

N.B Council also approved a Safeguarding Children & Vulnerable Adults Procedure to be used with the safeguarding policy.

It was a pleasure to attend the induction of two new Bedford Lions.




The Autumn Forum went very well and we had a great turnout.
